Our residents look forward to getting their monthly packs, but it's not just about the artwork, it's about the friendships they've built up. Care home staff




YOUR CHALLENGE -

Remember to always use scissors safely, ask a grown-up to help you with this craft.


Instructions

You will need...


Strips or coloured paper Scissors Glue Ribbon




Step 1 - Cut the coloured paper into 4 strips that are roughly 1 cm wide and 30 cm long.




Step 2 - Create a squared corner by glueing 2 strips together (as pictured).




Step 3 - Glue the next 2 strips overlapping (as pictured).



Creative.



Step 5 - When you are close to the bottom, glue your strips down and trim the excess paper.



Step 6 - Carefully make a hole at the top of your bookmark and thread your ribbon through.



Ta-da! Your bookmark is complete.
